The Red Lake Regional Heritage Centre explores the unique, fascinating and earthy culture of Northwestern Ontario.

In Flying Up, a large screen video in an object theater setting, legendary bush pilot Harold Farrington tells the history of bush planes and their direct impact on the development of the region.

Welcome to Red Lake, set in the kitchen of “Hell’s Acres”, the home of longtime Red Lake resident Gene Campbell, includes anecdotal tales from actual immigrants. Gene offers her own eccentric insights and advice on the art of living in an isolated community.

The jewel of the Heritage Centre’s collection is a large drum of great importance to the First Nations people of the area. *Fairwind’s Drum* offers four distinct storytelling experiences.

In Hard Rock Living visitors drop in on Cliff Harvey, old-time prospector, in his rustic camp. He regales them with colorful tales and memories about his own experiences, the great Red Lake Gold Rush of '26, and the history of gold mining in the area.
