Upper Canada Village, a pioneer heritage attraction, opened a new Discovery Centre rich in media exhibits that tell the stories of pre-Confederation Ontario. At the centre, visitors explore 19th century life, are immersed in battles from the War of 1812, and meet characters from the past who tell their compelling stories. The exhibits reveal both historical context of the times, and the fascinating details of individual lives.

Science North developed and produced the media for over a dozen individual exhibits. Highlights of the media exhibits include an interactive floor projection, an infantry charge through a projection fog wall, a fully multi-screen immersive theater of the Battle of Crysler's Farm, and a 10 foot long multi-use, multi-touch table

The experiences created are each part of a seamless whole, challenging, encouraging, and rewarding the spirit of discovery in the visitors to Upper Canada Village.
